Dear Comrade Parmenter:

Please accept my very sincere apology for not answering your letters at once. As it happened, I was passing through a spell of personal trouble - quite unconnected with the Socialist Movement - and the worry of it caused me to neglect anything that did not have to be dealt with at the moment. That is the explanation on the personal side, and I am happy to say that things now have considerably improved. Please forgive my negligence under stress.

To far as your article on "People's Democracy" is concerned,

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concerned, it has been set up by the printers for publishing in the forthcoming issue of Left. This will probably be the last issue, but there are some formalities to be observed before the last word is said. I can tell you personally that the majority of the shades will vote to close the paper down, unless by any chance they should get an offer to buy it and use it for quite a different purpose than the one in view when I took over the editorship with some faint hope that "Left" could be saved.

As soon as I read your article I knew that I would use it in the next issue of Left, and therefore I did not at once reply to you. I did not then expect that the next issue would have to be delayed so long. Subject to some reservations about some details of phrasing, I myself accept a very

similar

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similar position to the one you take up.

I am glad also to have been able to get in your remark on Wilfred Wigham's article on Equality.

As soon as I receive the issue I will see that copies are sent on to you, as you requested. You will note that I have taken the liberty of altering very slightly your translation of Engels. ~~Especially those parts in English best suited to our audience~~ You will appreciate the reasons for these minor changes if I mention that the only way in which an Englishman would normally use the words "the private" would be to describe

rank

"rank-and-file" soldiers, and even so he would be acutely conscious that in ribald slang "the privates" is often used to signify the testicles. I thought your comment a valuable one, and was extremely glad that it reached me in time to include it before "Left" in its present form and for its present purpose, ceased to be.
