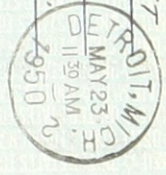

However, if you should have made any previous plans that would interfere with our meeting, then please do not change your plans on account of me.

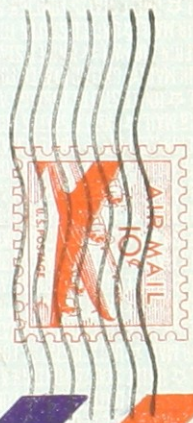
