76 British socialists will be called upon to decide whether they want to help a social revolution in Europe
[there is no workers' rev in Eur; only the threat of a comm rev, brings it into dependence of Russia; so Br. soc. helps reaction]
76 whether industries shall be given back to private capitalists, or whether they shall be used as the starting point for a planned, coordinated co-operative control of European economy

Russia 78 the State did not "wither away" as Lenin had predicted, but its machinery grew.
80 The Soviet Union has a fundamentally Soc economy as its base, but is not a socialist State. Of the 3 essentials of a Soc soc: common ownership of the means of production, a planned, collective economy, and democratic self-government of the people, the first 2 are present [!]; the third is absent. But there is no Socialism without full freedom.

81 Hungarian or Croat peasants ... look upon Russia as the mighty land where a great upheaval has made the peasants free. ... these peasants and their movements - which a slapdash jargon often dub's "Communist" - are profoundly democratic. ... want real freedom and self-government.

107. Hitler and his gang have made nationalism stink in the nostrils of mankind - ... the fact that Fascism has brutally subjugated a whole continent and extended its domination over two dozen nations ~~has~~ It has thus called forth a revolt of national feelings - It has rejuvenated nationalism; it has remade it a revolutionary force. ... National feeling is stronger than ever. But it is not the old nationalism, abused by the ruling classes and tainted with their decay. National symbols, flags and hymns and kings, have been revalued under its fiery breath. It is a new kind of nationalism. And it inspires all: the workers, too.

123 Politically, the peasant's movements (in Eastern Europe) are fundamentally democratic.
124 the movements in these countries will not be Communist, they will be revolutionary and democratic. ... This will be a peasants' revolution, striving for freedom, self-government, a way out of poverty and overpopulation and a solution of the obnoxious national problems by means of autonomy within a federation - ... Not will they object to nationalization of banks or industry in their own countries
125 In the West, freedom and democracy must be assured by the workers; in the East there is no basis for them but the peasants.
